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For the Parents

Dear Parents,

I feel blessed to have the opportunity to work with your child this quarter. My prayer is that your child's learning will result in his/her having a closer relationship with God.

Unit I, "Jesus: God's Chosen King," contains five lessons from the books of Ruth, 2 Samuel, and Luke. Lessons 1 and 2 deal with key moments in the history of Jesus' ancestors. Lesson 3 considers the role of John the Baptist in preparing the way for a "Savior," while lesson 4 highlights how Jesus' birth brings Good News to the world. Lesson 5 provides a glimpse of Jesus, the "Son of David," who bestows mercy on the needy.

Unit II, "Songs for the King," is a four-week study of four psalms that extol the reign of God. Psalm 10 (lesson 6) explores a lament in which the psalmist finds comfort in the assurance of God's reign. Psalm 93 (lesson 7) praises God as the eternal and all-powerful King. Psalms 103 and 145 (lessons 8 and 9) recount God's merciful and powerful acts as ruler of an everlasting kingdom.

Unit III, "Jesus Teaches about God's Kingdom," is comprised of four lessons from the book of Matthew. In lesson 10, Jesus teaches the disciples a "model prayer." Lesson 11 presents a frank acknowledgment that the kingdom of heaven will meet resistance in this world. Lesson 12 relays the promise of a reward in the kingdom for Jesus' committed followers. Finally, in lesson 13, Jesus tells a parable challenging His followers to serve the King faithfully.

You can have a discussion with your child about giving his or her life to God with help from the *ABCs of Salvation*, listed below.

- A. Say, "Admit you have sinned (see Psalm 32:5), or done wrong." Go through just a few of the Ten Commandments—stealing or lying and so forth. Tell how our sins separate us from God (see Isaiah 59:2 and Romans 3:23).
- B. Say, "Believe Jesus is God's Son. He took the punishment for our sins by dying on the cross (see Romans 5:8). We must believe that Jesus is God's Son and that God raised Him from the dead."
- C. Say, "Call on God to forgive you (see Acts 2:21). When we are sorry for our sins and want to stop doing wrong, we can ask God to forgive us (see Acts 16:31)."

Thank you for the opportunity to help shape your child's spiritual life.




Good Family Connections

"That's four generations of our family that will be here," Uncle Kevin noted. "You will have your mom, grandmother, granddaddy, and great-grandmother here."


"So, is Grandma Sarah your mother or your grandmother?" Braden asked.

David Desires to Build a Temple



"Why do you want it to be in our family forever?" Aqueelah questioned.


"I want your children and grandchildren to have a place to come visit that has meaning to you," Dad noted.

"You got it!" Dad responded.





John's father, Zechariah [Zek-uh-rye-uh], was filled with the Holy Spirit. He began speaking God's message and praising God.


Zechariah said, "Praise the Lord, the God of Israel, because He has come to help His people and set them free. He has saved and rescued them. He has provided us a mighty Savior in the house of His servant David." This was God's promise through his prophets.

Zechariah continued telling the people that God is kind. God had remembered His holy covenant (agreement) to Abraham and the people. God had promised Abraham that He

would rescue the people from their enemies. God would allow His people to serve Him without fear. God would make His people *holy* (pure) and right.

Zechariah then said to his son, John, "You, my child, will be called a prophet of the Most High. You will go before the Lord to prepare the way for Him. You will preach about the forgiveness of *sin* (wrongdoing)."

"I'm not tired," Mom said.


"Mom, why do you work so hard?" Koryn asked.

"Well, kind of, but what I'm preparing them for is so much bigger and greater than any of us could imagine. I'm getting them ready for the Word of God," Mom replied.






A "Bible Story" Crossword Puzzle
