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For the Parents

Dear Parents,

I feel blessed to have the opportunity to work with your child this quarter. My prayer is that your child's learning will result in their having a closer relationship with God.

Unit I, "God's Children Worship," begins with the example of Abraham (Abram), who built altars to mark occasions when God called him to greater faithfulness. Lesson 2 reveals Solomon's awareness of people's tendency to sin. Lesson 3 shows us Hezekiah's prayerful realization that the Lord alone is God. Lesson 4 demonstrates the importance of spiritual leadership, as evidenced through Josiah's call to return the people to the right worship.

Unit II, "God's Children Sing," looks at songs that Israel used in worship. Lesson 5 notes the deliverance of Israel from Pharaoh and the song Miriam led in response. In lesson 6, the children will hear the background story of the death of Uriah. In lesson 7, the children will study the miraculous rescue of Daniel's friends—and in lesson 8, Daniel's rescue from the lions' den. Lesson 9 looks at Psalm 62, a song of trust in God.

Unit III, "God's Children Give Thanks," looks at four songs. In lesson 10, the background is Psalm 23. The children's focus is on Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Lessons 11 and 12 focus on Psalms 150 and 100, which instruct everything and all people to praise God. Lesson 13 looks at Psalm 139, which serves as a reminder of the intimate relationship that God shares with humanity.

You can have a discussion with your child about giving his or her life to God with help from the *ABCs of Salvation*, listed below.

- A. Say, "Admit you have sinned (see Psalm 32:5), or done wrong." Go through just a few of the Ten Commandments—stealing or lying and so forth. Tell how our sins separate us from God (see Isaiah 59:2 and Romans 3:23).
- B. Say, "Believe Jesus is God's Son. He took the punishment for our sins by dying on the cross (see Romans 5:8). We must believe that Jesus is God's Son and that God raised Him from the dead."
- C. Say, "Call on God to forgive you (see Acts 2:21). When we are sorry for our sins and want to stop doing wrong, we can ask God to forgive us (see Acts 16:31)."

Thank you for the opportunity to help shape your child's spiritual life.

LESSON

"I don't believe I've seen you this excited in a long time," his mother replied.


"Did you know that they celebrate different holidays than we do and that even birthdays are celebrated with different traditions?" Jordan asked.


Could you help me create a list of how your family celebrates special events? Think of ways that you celebrate birthdays, holidays, and achievements. When we get together next week, we can share our lists.


Say It for Us

Help Me!



"Maybe we can all go together," Trey suggested. "What do you think?" "I think that's a great idea," Martin said with a smile.




